CHESTERFIELD HOSPITAL – Chapter 65

Grandma took Irene **HILL** there to visit her sister in 1959. I assume this is the **ROYAL CHESTERFIELD HOSPITAL**.

CRIPPLES CLINIC – see **HUCKNALL ORTHOPAEDIC CLINIC**

DUKERIES MATERNITY CENTRE – see **KING'S MILL HOSPITAL**

ELLERSLIE HOUSE HOME FOR PARALYSED SOLDIERS AND SAILORS – Chapter 26

Established in 1917, this home in Nottingham was visited by the **PRINCE OF WALES**, the future **KING EDWARD VIII**, in 1923. It continued to operate into the 1960s but with a broader mandate than just soldiers and sailors.

FOREST FEVER HOSPITAL – see **FOREST HOSPITAL**

FOREST HOSPITAL – Chapters 54, 78

This may have been a fever hospital although there is now an independent mental hospital by that name on **SOUTHWELL ROAD** in Mansfield. I have a vague recollection of dad mentioning that Ron Rowe had suffered from mental illness but I am not sure of this. Mum refers specifically to **FOREST FEVER HOSPITAL** in 1954.

HARLOW WOOD ORTHOPAEDIC HOSPITAL – Chapter 26

A hospital near Mansfield that was officially opened by the **DUCHESS OF YORK** in 1929. The hospital closed in 1995.

HUCKNALL CLINIC – see **HUCKNALL ORTHOPAEDIC CLINIC**

HUCKNALL ORTHOPAEDIC CLINIC – Chapter 78

Clinic that Walter **MALTBY** attended to have a plaster cast fitted. It opened in 1928 as a **CRIPPLES CLINIC**.

JENNY LIND CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL – Chapter 78, 81

There has been a children's hospital in Norwich since 1853. Originally in Pottergate, it moved to Unthank Road in 1900. It merged with the **NORFOLK AND NORWICH HOSPITAL** in 1975 and was then relocated to the new hospital site in 2001.

KELLING SANATORIUM – Chapter 79

Apparently, this was a sanatorium for children in Norfolk. Mum attended a film about this at Young Wives in the early sixties.

KING'S MILL HOSPITAL – Chapters 50, 65, 71, 78

This hospital is located between Sutton in Ashfield and Mansfield. It opened as a military hospital in 1942. It was officially opened in 1951 and the **DUKERIES MATERNITY CENTRE** was opened in 1975. New facilities were procured in 2005 and opened in 2011.

MANSFIELD COMMUNITY HOSPITAL – Chapter 58

The current hospital in Mansfield and it provides rehabilitation services. This is a new hospital, on the site of one founded in 1882, that started life as the **MANSFIELD UNION WORKHOUSE** before becoming part of the **VICTORIA HOSPITAL**. The part of the hospital that had been the workhouse was demolished in 2007.

MANSFIELD GENERAL HOSPITAL – Chapters 5, 31, 35, 37, **50**, 65, 69, 78

Mansfield General Hospital was built in 1890 but closed in 1992 and was demolished in 2013. In Chapters 5 and 31, reference is made just to Mansfield Hospital but it is assumed that the General Hospital is intended.

MANSFIELD HOSPITAL – see **MANSFIELD GENERAL HOSPITAL**

MANSFIELD UNION WORKHOUSE – see **MANSFIELD COMMUNITY HOSPITAL**

NEWSTEAD NURSING HOME – Chapter 65

Identified by grandad as the place where Dr **WALLER** died in 1959.

NORFOLK AND NORWICH HOSPITAL – Background

The main hospital in Norwich. It re=located from the city centre to the current site in Colney in 2001.

NORWICH COMMUNITY HOSPITAL – see **WEST NORWICH HOSPITAL**

NOTTINGHAM CITY HOSPITAL – Chapter 65

This is one of Nottingham's current hospitals. It had its origins in the workhouse but became the City Infirmary in 1930 and the City Hospital in 1937.

NOTTINGHAM EYE INFIRMARY – Chapter **65**, 78

An Eye Dispensary was first established in Nottingham on Park Row in 1859. In 1866, it moved to St James' Street and became the Nottingham and Midland Eye Infirmary. In 1912, it moved again to a purpose-built Eye Hospital on the Ropewalk. In 1959, it became the Nottingham Eye Hospital. It closed in 1983 when eye services moved to the new University Hospital. The Ropewalk building became the headquarters of the Nottinghamshire Family Practitioner Committee. I have found the building on Google Streetview as it still says Nottm & Midland Eye Infirmary on the front. It appears that the building may have been converted to flats.

NOTTINGHAM GENERAL HOSPITAL – Chapters 26, **47**, 65

Nottingham Hospital was a major hospital in Nottingham. It was founded in 1781 and closed in 1992. The main hospital block is now home to the offices of Nottingham City Clinical Commissioning Group and Nottingham CityCare Partnership. There was also a Memorial Nurses' Home within its grounds.

RANSOM SANATORIUM – Chapters **50**, 54, 78

TB Sanatorium near Mansfield. It was also known as **RATCHER HILL HOSPITAL**. It opened in 1902 and, in 190, was renamed after Dr William Branwell **RANSOM** who had been the chief doctor there. It operated as a hospital until 1987 and, in 1990, the buildings were sold. Mum was sent there for a chest Xray in April 1952 because of a prolonged "chill".

RATCHER HILL HOSPITAL – see **RANSOM SANATORIUM**

ROUNDWELL MEDICAL CENTRE – Chapter 80

Medical Centre in Costessey. This was constructed in 2009 on the site of the old **ROUNDWELL** pub.

SAXONDALE HOSPITAL – Chapter 78

Mental hospital in Radcliffe on Trent. It was opened in 1902 and closed in 1988 when it was converted to housing.

SOUTHWELL ROAD HOSPITAL MANSFIELD – see **FOREST HOSPITAL**

TUCKSWOOD CLINIC – Chapter 86

Clinic we attended when we first moved to Norwich and were living in a flat in Newmarket Road.

VICTORIA HOSPITAL – see **MANSFIELD COMMUNITY HOSPITAL**

WEST BRIDGFORD NURSING HOME – Chapter 65

Identified by mum as the place where Dr **WALLER** died in 1959.

WEST NORWICH HOSPITAL – Chapter 78

Hospital in Norfolk where, in 1963, I saw a paediatrician concerning asthma. It has been called the **NORWICH COMMUNITY HOSPITAL** since 2005. It became the **WEST NORWICH** in 1948 when it joined the NHS.
